



EDGEUNITY “How-To” Access Guide

IMPORTANT: Have a copy of the student’s e-learning schedule ready. This e-learning schedule will show you the URL, the username and password for websites being used in middle and high school.



There are two types of assignments in Edgenuity.

1 – Individual Learning Paths: These are created based on student NWEA test scores. These will be assigned by Math or Reading/Language Arts teachers as activities.

2 – High School Credit Courses: These are complete online courses which when finished provide the learner with a high school credit in the designated subject area.

Look closely at the weekly lesson guides on the teacher’s website to see in which module the student should be working.
